SPOTLIGHT

Amendments To Florida Administrative Code

Reading Endorsement: Rule 6A-4.0292, F.A.C., now allows teachers who receive a passing score on the Reading Subject Area Exam to be awarded the Reading Endorsement without completing the previously required coursework. *(Note: For teachers who choose to complete the coursework—any teacher who has already completed one of the competencies under the previous plan will not have to retake that competency under the new plan).*

Renewal & Reinstatement of a Professional Certificate:

Rule 6A-4.0051, F.A.C., now requires teachers with certificates in Elementary Education (K-6), Prekindergarten/Primary Education (age 3– grade 3), Elementary Education (grade 1-6), Primary Education (grades K-3), English (6-12), Reading (K-12), Reading (Endorsement), and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL K-12) to take two credit hours (or 40 hours of professional development) in the use of explicit, systematic, and sequential approaches to reading instruction, developing phonemic awareness and implementing multisensory intervention strategies in order to renew professional certificates with a beginning validity period of July 1, 2020. *(This means, any teacher who holds a certificate from the list above and whose certificate expires in 2025 or later will have to complete the two credit hours/40 professional development hours in order to renew in 2025).*

Guidance Counselors: Rule 6A-4.0181, F.A.C., updated the job title from Guidance and Counseling to School Counseling, which reflects changes in Florida Law. In addition, revisions update and refine one of the pathways to certification as a school counselor and allow similar clinical counseling professionals an avenue to become certified school counselors. This rule will provide professional credentials to align with the level of mental health services provided in schools and may increase the number of certified school counselors in Florida's schools.

School Social Workers: Rule 6A-4.035, F.A.C., now provides professional credentials that align with the level of mental health services provided in schools. In addition, the revised rule may increase the number of certified school social workers by allowing a pathway for those with a master's level social work degree who served children and families in a setting other than a prekindergarten, elementary or secondary school.

The Bureau of Educator Certification will issue additional guidance on these topics.

Understanding your Temporary Certificate Advisement

Dear new teachers,

Welcome back from the holiday break! Wasn't it so nice to have a full week off for Thanksgiving and two full weeks off for winter break?!

Now that you've had time to relax and recharge, it's time to really to start focusing on completing some of the certification requirements listed on your Statement of Eligibility (SOE).

Your friends in certification may have already sent you, or will be sending you, a Temporary Certificate Advisement to help you better understand what needs to be completed before your temporary certificate expires.

Here's what a typical Advisement looks like:


1) The date your temporary certificate expires (*Note: ALL requirements MUST be complete by this date.*)

2) Requirements recommended to be completed during the first year of your temporary certificate

3) Requirements recommended to be completed during the second year of your temporary certificate

4) Requirements recommended to be completed during the third (final) year of your temporary certificate.

Education Coursework: Complete the ACE or EPI Program, or complete through an accredited college/university. For additional certification information, please visit our website: https://polkschoolsfl.com/certification/

Note: Your Temporary Certificate Advisement is created specifically for you based on your requirements listed on your Statement of Eligibility that was issued by the Florida Department of Education. Also, please pay special attention to the date your temporary certificate expires to ensure that you complete all requirements by that date.

Senate Bill 7070 modified temporary certificate extension allowance to include highly effective ratings and completion of a two-year mentorship program. The State Board of Education now allows the department to extend the validity period of a temporary certificate for two years when the requirements for the professional certificate were not completed due to serious illness or injury to the applicant, the military service of an applicant's spouse, other extraordinary extenuating circumstances, or if the certificate holder is rated highly effective on the immediate prior year's performance evaluation, or has completed a two-year mentorship program.

USEFUL TIPS: INSERVICE POINTS FOR RENEWALS

When renewing your professional teaching certificate, use these helpful tips to ensure you have the proper amount of inservice points:

Tip #1: If you have four or less academic areas on your certificate, you will need a minimum of 120 inservice points which include 20 inservice points in teaching students with disabilities (SWD). *Note: Endorsements are not an academic area and do not require any inservice points to renew.*

Tip #2: Did you know there are other methods to renew instead of inservice points? The methods include: inservice points, college credit, subject area exam, National Board certification, college teaching experience and Schools of Excellence. Learn more!

Tip #3: Inservice records can be found in NetConnect. If you are unable to view certain points you believe should be on your record, contact Patti Wilkins, *patti.wilkins@polk-fl.net*. Or, if you have transferred points from a different county, be sure they are sent to Patti Wilkins.

Tip #4: There are multiple options to meet the SWD requirement, however, the easiest (and free!) way is to complete a FDLRS course. Visit <u>www.fl-pda.org</u> to complete a course. Note: Be sure to follow the color legend for courses that meet the SWD credit. Learn more!

CERTIFICATION FAQ

How do I print my teaching certificate?

If your certificate was issued prior to November 2017 (when the Bureau of Certification launched their new VERSA system) then you will not be able to print your certificate (you should have received a hard copy certificate in the mail at that time). Those with certificates issued after November 2017 can now log in to their VERSA account and view and/or print their certificate. *Note: After you are logged in to your account, locate the "View Documents" option and select your name, then click "Select" next to it to view/print your certificate.*

I previously taught Out of Field (OOF) and did not satisfy that Agreement to Earn. Can I go OOF again in a new area and receive a new Agreement to Earn?

No. Per Florida Administrative Code (FAC) 6A-1.0503, you are not permitted to go out of field in another coverage until the previous *Agreement to Earn* is satisfied.

Type of Certificate	Helpful Information to renew/ upgrade:
Professional	Visit <u>polkschoolsfl.com/certification</u> and follow the steps under the renewal information section
Temporary	It is recommended to apply now through the FLDOE to upgrade to the professional certificate. Reference your SOE and the letter the FLDOE sent you dated 6/28/19 regarding this process to ensure all requirements are met prior to your certificate expiring.
District	Reference the email that was sent in the fall. If you cannot locate it, then be on the lookout for another email reminder that will be sent during the week of Jan. 13.

I have completed my payment in Staff Portal and my RENEWAL application online with the FLDOE. What are my next steps?

Once you complete your payment method in Staff Portal and your Renewal application with the FLDOE, your friends in certification will check to make sure you have the proper amount of inservice points, and they will renew your certificate. You do not have any next steps. *Note: The certification specialists process applications in the order they are received. Also, please understand that there are hundreds of applications. The certification specialists are working diligently to process the applications as quickly as possible.*

How can I renew an endorsement on my certificate?

Endorsements renew automatically when you renew your professional teaching certificate. They are not considered an academic area, and therefore, you do not need inservice points to renew endorsements.

CERTIFICATION FAQ

Does the updated ruling pertaining to the renewal and reinstatement of a Professional Certificate (obtaining two credit hours/40 professional development points in reading) apply to me if I am renewing my certificate that expires June 30, 2020?

No, any teacher who holds a certificate from the list in the Amendments (Rule 6A-4.0051, F.A.C.) in this newsletter's Spotlight section and whose certificate expires in **2025 or later** will have to complete the two credit hours/40 professional development hours in order to renew in 2025.

What is the ACE Program, and how do I apply?

The ACE Professional Development Certification Program is designed for new K-12 teachers who have a non-education degree and wish to become professionally certified. It offers an attractive, low-cost alternative to the expense of education courses. <u>View the latest flyer to</u> <u>get more information and to learn how to apply.</u>

How can I access my advisement for my temporary certificate?

Search your inbox for an email from *Workflow* with the subject line of *Teacher Certification Advisement*.

Note: Teachers hired this school year who hold a temporary certificate or are eligible to hold a temporary certificate can expect to receive their advisement by: *March 6 if hired during Sept. – Feb. or May 1 if hired during March – April.* Those hired through August should have received their Temporary Advisement prior to the winter break.

REMINDER!

The FLDOE does **not** notify the district when a teacher's certification status changes. The certification office must rely on each teacher to provide them with an update (i.e. passed a test, received their certificate, added an endorsement or subject, etc.)

Hot Off the Press - Reading Coaches

Are you a current reading coach or interested in becoming a reading coach in the future?

If so, take notice. The qualifications to serve as a reading or literacy coach have changed **per 6A-6.053** (i.e., K-12 Comprehensive Evidence-Based Reading Plan).

Reading/literacy coaches must meet the following minimum qualifications beginning the 2020-2021 school year:

- ▶ Must have a minimum of a bachelor's degree and advanced coursework or professional development in reading.
- ► Must be rated highly effective and be endorsed or K-12 certified in the area of reading.
- ► Must have experience as a successful classroom teacher.
- Coaches must exhibit knowledge of evidence based reading research, special expertise in quality reading instruction and infusing reading strategies into content area instruction, and data management skills.
- ► Must have a strong knowledge base in working with adult learners.
- ▶ Must be excellent communicators with outstanding presentation, interpersonal, and time management skills.

DID? YOU: KNOW

PCPS may be able to reimburse your Subject Area Exam!

Teachers on a temporary certificate or teachers who have chosen to accept an out-of-field assignment (excluding ESOL, Gifted, Educational Leadership, and Reading) may be eligible for reimbursement for the cost of passing the associated subject area exam as well as the \$75 add-on fee. (Note: Exams must be taken and passed between July 1, 2019 and May 1, 2020 to be eligible for reimbursement consideration.)

Teachers seeking reimbursement must meet eligibility criteria. Contact <u>teacherengagement@polk-fl.net</u> to access the SAE Reimbursement Guidelines and Application.
